

EUDF Application Guide

A step-by-step reference for applying to EUDF funding programmes and open roles.

Applying for Funding

1. Identify your programme and grant category

Review the four EUDF programmes and, where relevant, the specific funding sector and grant category that best matches your project. Each grant category has an indicative funding range between €2,000 and €500,000.

2. Open the Funding Application Form

Provide your organization or business name, a contact person, and your organization's contact details (email, phone, country).

3. Describe your funding request

Select the relevant programme, provide a project title, and write a project summary of 500 words or fewer covering what the project does, who it serves, and the outcomes you expect. Provide your estimated funding amount required.

4. Confirm the declaration and submit

Confirm that your information is accurate and that you agree to be contacted about your application, then submit. This is an initial expression of interest — you are not asked to upload documents or submit a full proposal at this stage.

5. Wait for review

Your application is reviewed by EUDF's Grants Team, typically within 4–8 weeks. If shortlisted, you will receive the official EUDF Grant Proposal Form together with instructions for the next stage.

Applying for a Role

1. Browse open roles

EUDF currently hires across Kenya, Zambia, South Africa, and remote positions, spanning funding, skills, community, and youth programme work.

2. Open the Career Application Form

Provide your full name, email, phone number, country, and city, along with the exact position you are applying for.

3. Add a cover letter (optional but recommended)

Briefly explain who you are, why you're a good fit for the role, and your relevant experience.

4. Upload your CV

Attach your CV as a PDF or Word document, up to 5MB.

5. Submit and wait for review

Your application is submitted directly to EUDF's People Team for review.

Minimum Requirements for Roles

Unless otherwise stated on a specific listing, EUDF roles require a Bachelor's degree (or equivalent) and at least 2 years of relevant professional experience.
